Before 1820 Wenlock is only to be found editions of Walker's Companion to Rippon's Tune Book, published between 1811 and 1820, and always set to the Evans's hymn, of which there are only two verses. Jonathan Evans was a Coventry born ribbon weaver who joined the congregation of Revd G. Burder in 1778. He began preaching at Foleshill, Coventry, in 1782, and ministered there from 1795 until his death in 1809. The tune is unattributed. Transposed down one tone.
